



Jernej Ule obtained his BSc at the University of Ljubljana and Ph.D. from Rockefeller University in New York. In 2006 he started his own research group in Cambridge, UK, then moved to University London and Francis Crick Institute in London, where he retains a small satellite team. In 2022 he relocated with most of his team to King's College London, where he is a Centre Director and Professor of Neurodegeneration Research. He also co-supervises and collaborates with researchers at Institute of Chemistry in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Together with his team, Jernej studies how protein-RNA complexes contribute to homeostatic and adaptive mechanisms, especially in the context of aging and neurodegenerative diseases.
