



Piero Carninci is the Head of the Genomics Research Centre–Functional Genomics at Human Technopole in Milan, and Team Director of the Laboratory for Transcriptome Technology and member of the RIKEN Science Council at RIKEN, Japan. Since April 2025, he has served as President of the Human Genome Organisation (HUGO). His research focuses on transcriptomics, functional genomics and the regulatory roles of non-coding RNAs. He has developed technologies to map multiple dimensions of the transcriptome, including regulatory elements such as promoters and enhancers, as well as transcribed capped RNAs, with particular emphasis on long non-coding RNAs. He has played leading roles in major international initiatives, including FANTOM and the Human Cell Atlas. His work has contributed substantially to understanding mammalian transcription, RNA–chromatin interactions and gene-regulatory networks. He has co-authored approximately 450 scientific publications, is an inventor on more than 50 patents.
